# Marie Gluesenkamp Perez (D-WA-03)

- Marie Gluesenkamp Perez defeated Republican Joe Kent to replace Rep. Jamie Herrera Beutler, who lost to Kent in the Republican primary.
- Gluesenkamp Perez and her husband own an independent auto-repair shop.
- Her father immigrated to Washington from Mexico.
- *Her priorities include lowering healthcare and childcare costs, investing in clean energy, expanding apprenticeship and skill training programs, reproductive rights, supporting small businesses, and worker's rights.*



# Lori Chavez-DeRemer (R-OR-05)

- Lori Chavez-DeRemer defeated Democrat Jamie McLeod-Skinner to replace Rep. Kurt Schrader, who lost to McLeod-Skinner in the Democratic primary.
- Chavez-DeRemer served as the mayor of Happy Valley, Oregon from 2010-2018.
- She and her husband run several medical clinics throughout the Pacific Northwest.
- *Her priorities include improving fighting homelessness, securing the border, inflation, parental choice in education, balancing the budget, public safety, the Second Amendment, and stopping Critical Race Theory.*



# Kevin Mullin (D-CA-15)

---

- Kevin Mullin defeated fellow Democrat David Canepa to replace retiring Rep. Jackie Speier.
- Mullin has served in the California State Assembly since 2012. He previously served as the mayor of South San Francisco.
- He is the founder of KM2 Communications, a multimedia production business.
- *His priorities include affordable housing, workforce development, child care, Medicare for All, fighting climate change, reproductive rights, and lowering prescription drug costs.*



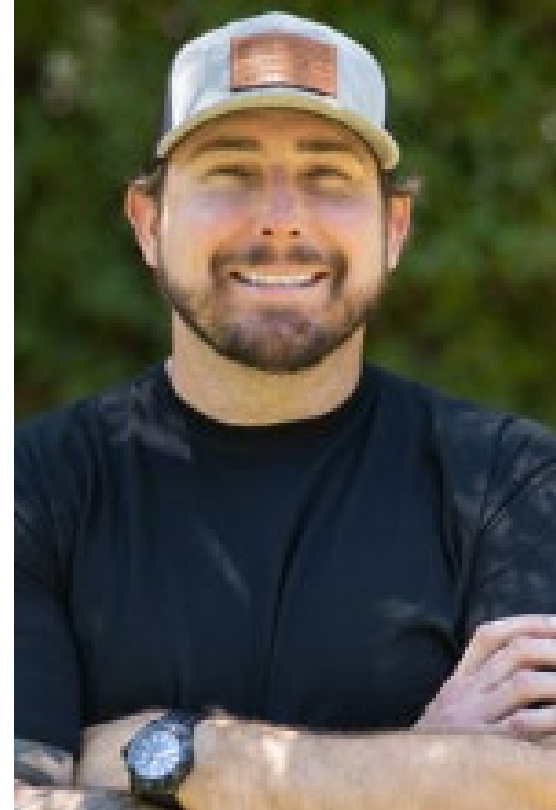
# Val Hoyle (D-OR-04)

- Val Hoyle defeated Republican Alek Skarlatos to replace retiring Rep. Peter DeFazio.
- Hoyle has served as the Oregon Commissioner of Labor and Industries since 2019.
- She served in the Oregon House of Representatives from 2009-2017.
- Hoyle previously worked in sales and marketing for bicycle manufacturing companies.
- *Her priorities include reproductive rights, climate change, inflation, affordable housing, increasing the federal minimum wage, paid family and medical leave, the PRO Act, universal health care legislation, and investing in public education.*



# Eli Crane (R-AZ-02)

- Eli Crane defeated incumbent Democratic Rep. Tom O'Halleran.
- Crane and his wife founded Bottle Breacher, a small business that employs veterans.
- He is a brand ambassador for Sig Sauer firearms.
- Crane served in the Navy from 2001-2014.
- *His priorities include border security, election integrity, medical freedom, stopping Critical Race Theory in schools, free speech, the Second Amendment, protecting life, and cutting taxes and regulations.*



# Eric Sorenson (D-IL-17)

---

- Eric Sorenson defeated Republican Esther Joy King to replace retiring Rep. Cheri Bustos.
- Sorenson worked as a meteorologist for the past 22 years on the local NBC affiliate in Rockford and the Quad Cities.
- He is a member of the LGBTQ community and serves on the boards of Clock, Inc. and The Project of the Quad Cities, initiatives that aim to connect vulnerable individuals to health services.
- *His priorities include reproductive rights, addressing climate change, creating sustainable jobs, lowering health care costs, and investing in our schools.*



# Sydney Kamlager (D-CA-37)

- Sydney Kamlager defeated fellow Democrat Jan Perry to replace Rep. Karen Bass, who ran for mayor of Los Angeles.
- Kamlager has served in the California State Senate since 2021. She served in the California State Assembly from 2018-2021.
- She previously served as president of the Los Angeles Community College District Board of Trustees and on the Los Angeles County Commission on Children and Families.
- *Her priorities include reproductive justice, health care for all, a Green New Deal, criminal justice reform, innovative investments in housing, and job creation to create economic justice.*



# Gabriel Vasquez (D-NM-02)

- Gabriel Vasquez defeated incumbent Rep. Yvette Herrell.
- Vasquez serves as the director of strategy and partnerships at Hispanics Enjoying Camping, Hunting, and the Outdoors, a program sponsored by the National Wildlife Federation.
- He served as a Las Cruces city councilor from 2017-2021.
- *His priorities include cutting taxes for working families, raising the minimum wage, passing the PRO Act, expanding Medicare, protecting New Mexico's public lands, investing in clean energy, comprehensive immigration reform, and reproductive rights.*



# Ryan Zinke (R-MT-01)

- Ryan Zinke defeated Democrat Monica Tranel in the newly apportioned district in MT-01.
- Zinke served as secretary of the interior during the Trump Administration from 2017 to 2019.
- He represented Montana's at-large congressional district from 2015 to 2017.
- *His priorities include tax reform, cutting regulations and spending, finishing the border wall, public access to public lands, forest management, and supporting the Second Amendment and hunting and fishing rights.*



# Thomas Kean Jr. (R-NJ-07)

- Thomas Kean Jr. defeated incumbent Rep. Tom Malinowski.
- Kean served in the New Jersey State Senate from 2003-2022. He was a member of the New Jersey General Assembly from 2001-2003.
- He is the son of former New Jersey Governor Thomas Kean Sr., and the grandson of former Rep. Robert Kean.
- Kean began his career at the Environmental Protection Agency during President George H.W. Bush's Administration.
- *His priorities include cutting spending, tackling inflation, middle class tax relief, energy independence, and promoting American industry.*



# Zach Nunn (R-IA-03)

---

- Zach Nunn defeated incumbent Rep. Cindy Axne.
- Nunn has served in the Iowa State Senate since 2019. He previously served in the Iowa House of Representatives from 2015-2019.
- He and his wife own a marketing and design small business.
- Nunn is an Air Force veteran and serves as a lieutenant colonel in the Iowa Air National Guard.
- *His priorities include protecting the Second Amendment, free speech, tax cuts, border security, agriculture, the right to life, and a strong military.*



# John James (R-MI-10)

---

- John James defeated Democrat Carl Marlinga for the newly created seat in MI-10.
- James was the Republican nominee for Senate in 2020 and 2018, but lost to Sens. Gary Peters and Debbie Stabenow.
- James previously ran his family's business, James Group International, a supply chain management services company.
- James graduated from West Point and served in the US Army for eight years.
- *His priorities include school choice, workforce development, lowering taxes, patient-centered healthcare, and securing the border.*



# Nicholas LaLota (R-NY-01)

---

- Nicholas LaLota defeated Democrat Bridget Fleming in the race to replace Rep. Lee Zeldin, who ran for Governor.
- LaLota is the chief of staff for the Suffolk County Legislature. He previously served as the commissioner of the Suffolk County Board of Elections.
- LaLota served as a surface warfare officer in the Navy from 1996-2007.
- *His priorities include election integrity, lowering prescription drug costs, inflation, law enforcement, the Second Amendment, standing up to China, and standing with Israel.*



# George Devolder-Santos (R-NY-03)

- George Devolder-Santos defeated Democrat Robert Zimmerman to replace retiring Rep. Tom Suozzi.
- Devolder-Santos lost to Suozzi by 12 points in 2020.
- Devolder-Santos works for his family's company, Devolder Organizations. He previously worked for Goldman Sachs and Citigroup.
- He is a first-generation American. His parents immigrated from Brazil.
- *His priorities include reducing regulations, energy independence, inflation, public safety, securing the border, a flat tax rate, and pandemic preparedness.*



# Anthony D'Esposito (R-NY-04)

- Anthony D'Esposito defeated Democrat Laura Gillen to replace retiring Rep. Kathleen Rice.
- D'Esposito is a member of the Hempstead Town Council.
- He is a retired New York Police Department detective, and a member of the New York Association of Fire Chiefs.
- *His priorities include inflation, public safety, energy independence, securing the border, strengthening the employer-provided health system, parental involvement in education, restoring the SALT exemption, and standing with Israel.*



# Michael Lawler (R-NY-17)

---

- Michael Lawler defeated incumbent Rep. Sean Patrick Maloney.
- Lawler has served in the New York State Assembly since 2021.
- He is a partner at Checkmate Strategies, a political communications firm.
- Lawler previously served as executive director of the New York Republican Party, and as the Orangetown deputy town supervisor.
- *His priorities include inflation, public safety, empowering parents in education, school choice, securing the border, expanded domestic energy production, and protecting Social Security and Medicare.*



# Marcus Molinaro (R-NY-19)

- Marcus Molinaro defeated Democrat Josh Riley for the newly redrawn seat in NY-19.
- Molinaro has served as the Dutchess County Executive since 2012. He served in the New York State Assembly from 2007-2012.
- Molinaro was the Republican nominee for Governor in 2018, but lost to Andrew Cuomo by 23 points.
- *His priorities include reducing inflation, solving the energy crisis, advocating for cryptocurrency and digital assets, pro-Israel policies, and addressing the mental health crisis.*



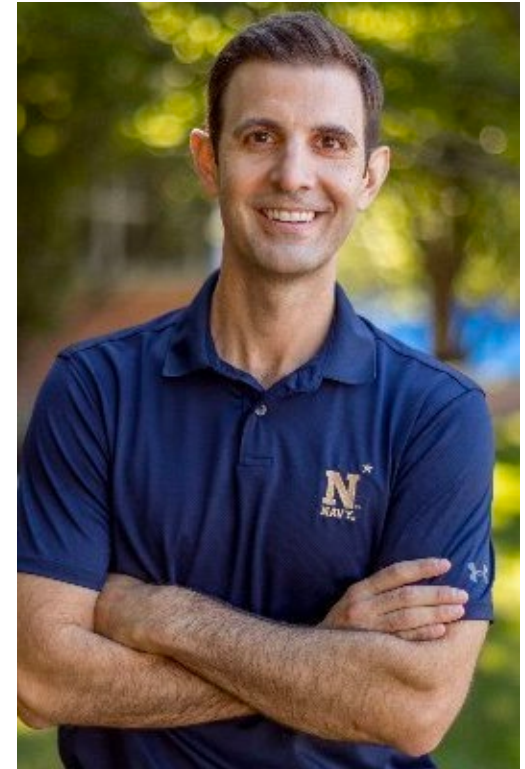
# Summer Lee (D-PA-12)

- Democrat Summer Lee defeated Republican Michael Doyle for the newly created seat in PA-12.
- Lee has served in the Pennsylvania State Legislature since 2018.
- She previously worked as a labor organizer and for the Fight for \$15 campaign.
- Lee is the first Black woman elected to Congress from Pennsylvania.
- *Her priorities include passing the PRO Act, the Green New Deal, Medicare for All, equitable funding for public schools, campaign finance reform, and expanding the Supreme Court.*



# Chris Deluzio (D-PA-17)

- Chris Deluzio defeated Republican Jeremy Shaffer to replace retiring Rep. Conor Lamb.
- Deluzio is a voting rights attorney and the policy director at Pitt Cyber. He previously worked at the Brennan Center for Justice.
- Deluzio is a Navy veteran, where he served as an active-duty surface warfare officer.
- *His priorities include defending democracy, passing the PRO Act, reproductive rights, antitrust enforcement, bringing union manufacturing jobs back to PA, expanding Medicare, clean energy, and protecting Social Security.*



# Derrick Van Orden (R-WI-03)

- Derrick Van Orden defeated Democrat Brad Pfaff to replace retiring Rep. Ron Kind.
- Van Orden served in the Navy for 26 years, retiring as a Navy SEAL senior chief.
- He and his wife run the Butternut Cafe and live on their family farm.
- *His priorities include repealing Obamacare, public safety, border security, the dairy industry, cutting taxes, and cutting red tape at the VA.*



# Dale Strong (R-AL-05)

- Dale Strong defeated Democrat Kathy Warner-Stanton to replace Rep. Mo Brooks, who ran for Senate instead of seeking reelection.
- In 2012, Strong was the first Republican elected as chairman of the Madison County Commission. He was originally elected as a commissioner for District 4 in 1996.
- He serves as member of the Monrovia Volunteer Fire Department as a firefighter and EMT.
- *Strong supports:*
  - *“doing more with less, balancing our budget, and demanding accountability.”*
  - *“stand[ing] with law enforcement and mak[ing] sure they have the support and equipment to protect our families.”*
  - *“building the wall, sending illegals back to their country of origin, and fully enforcing the law on those that are in our country illegally.”*
  - *“investing more in basic research and the vaccine development to prepare for the next outbreak.”*



# Robert Garcia (D-CA-42)

- Robert Garcia defeated Republican John Briscoe.
- Garcia has served as the mayor of Long Beach, CA, since July 2014. His term expires December 20, 2022.
- Prior to that, he was on the Long Beach City Council from 2009-2014, serving as vice-mayor during the last two years of his term.
- Garcia lost his mother and stepfather to COVID-19.
- *His priorities include preparing for future pandemics and emergencies, defending democracy from the extreme far-right, raising the minimum wage to \$15, expanding the social safety net, Medicare for All, ending the gun violence epidemic, supporting the Green New Deal, and ending Citizens United.*



# Brittany Pettersen (D-CO-07)

- Brittany Pettersen defeated Republican Erik Aadland to replace retiring Rep. Ed Perlmutter.
- Pettersen currently serves as a member of the Colorado State Senate.
- From 2013 through 2019, Pettersen served in the Colorado House of Representatives where she chaired the Education Committee.
- *Her priorities include reducing health care costs, energy independence, investing in renewable energy, water conservation, early childhood education, and abortion rights.*



# Aaron Bean (R-FL-04)

---

- Aaron Bean defeated Democrat LaShonda Holloway to succeed Rep. John Rutherford, who chose to run in FL-05 following redistricting.
- Bean is the president pro tempore in the Florida Senate.
- He previously served in the Florida House of Representatives for eight years.
- Bean also served as city commissioner and mayor of Fernandina Beach.
- *Bean will “stand up for the free state of Florida and carry the torch of conservative Northeast Florida and the Ron DeSantis Doctrine, a doctrine of freedom for all Americans, to Washington.”*



# Cory Mills (R-FL-07)

- Cory Mills defeated Democrat Karen Green for the newly created seat in FL-07.
- Mills was appointed to serve as an advisor to the Department of Defense by President Trump.
- Mills is a US Army combat veteran who served in Iraq and Afghanistan.
- *“Cory is a husband, father, patriot, combat veteran, entrepreneur, foreign policy expert, and true American conservative. Cory believes in FIGHTING for the people, restoring the voice of ‘We The People’ -- America’s voice -- and making America First Again.”*



# Maxwell Frost (D-FL-10)

- Maxwell Frost defeated Republican Calvin Wimbish to replace Rep. Val Demings, who ran for Senate.
- Frost is 25 years old and will be the first Gen Z member of Congress.
- Frost previously worked as the national organizing director for March for Our Lives, and as a national organizing specialist for the ACLU.
- He also served as the national advance manager for Bernie Sanders for President.
- *His priorities include fighting for Medicare for All, ending gun violence, passing the Green New Deal, addressing the housing crisis, investing in sustainable transportation, and reforming the justice system.*



# Anna Paulina Luna (R-FL-13)

---

- Anna Paulina Luna defeated Democrat Eric Lynn to replace Rep. Charlie Crist, who ran for Governor.
- Luna previously served as the director of Hispanic engagement for Turning Point USA.
- Luna served in the United States Air Force from 2009 through 2018.
- *Her priorities include finishing the border wall, ending DACA, restoring the Keystone Pipeline, improving services for veterans, expanding school choice, and fighting for fair trade deals.*



# Laurel Lee (R-FL-15)

---

- Laurel Lee defeated Democrat Alan Cohn for the newly created seat in FL-15.
- Lee served as the secretary of state of Florida from 2019-2022. She was appointed by Gov. DeSantis.
- Lee served as a judge on the 13<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit Court in Florida from 2013-2019.
- *Her priorities include cutting spending, lowering taxes, reviving the Keystone Pipeline, protecting the Second Amendment, finishing the border wall, religious liberty, and election integrity.*



# Jared Moskowitz (D-FL-23)

- Jared Moskowitz defeated Republican Joe Budd to replace Rep. Ted Deutch, who did not seek reelection.
- Moskowitz is a Broward County Commissioner.
- He served as Florida's director of emergency management during the COVID-19 pandemic, a position he was appointed to by Republican Gov. Ron DeSantis.
- Moskowitz served as a Florida state representative from 2012 through 2018.
- *His priorities include defending democracy, preventing gun violence, safeguarding reproductive rights, advocating for the LGBTQ community, protecting healthcare, standing up for Israel, and investing in environmental protection.*



# Rich McCormick (R-GA-06)

- Rich McCormick defeated Democrat Bob Christian to succeed Democratic Rep. Lucy McBath, who chose to run in GA-07 following redistricting.
- McCormick is an emergency room doctor. He previously served in the Marine Corps and Navy for over 20 years.
- As a Marine, he flew helicopters and taught at Georgia Tech and Morehouse College as the marine officer instructor.
- In the Navy, he earned the rank of commander and served as the department head for the Emergency Medicine Department in Kandahar, Afghanistan.
- *His priorities include providing tax relief for middle class families, removing unnecessary regulations, fully funding law enforcement, building the wall, defending the 2nd Amendment, and stopping socialized healthcare.*



# Mike Collins (R-GA-10)

- Mike Collins defeated Democrat Tabitha Johnson-Green to replace Rep. Jody Hice, who ran for Georgia Secretary of State.
- For the past 28 years, Collins has owned and operated several small businesses, including his trucking company that has a fleet of 115 semi-trucks.
- He graduated with a business degree from Georgia State University.
- *Three key messages of his campaign are:*
  - *“Pro-Trump: I’m not afraid or ashamed to stand up for the man that had the courage to stand up for America and regular hard working folks in the face of unprecedented attacks from fake news media, the elites and the establishment.”*
  - *“Conservative Fighter: I’ve been Conservative to the core my entire life. I value life, liberty and our God-given rights enumerated in our Constitution.”*
  - *“Outsider: I have never held a political office before. I have spent the last 30 years raising a family and building a successful trucking business. I live in the real world where my decisions affect my business and the lives of the employees that work for me.”*



# Jill Tokuda (D-HI-02)

---

- Jill Tokuda defeated Republican Joseph Akana to replace Rep. Kai Kahele, who ran for Governor.
- Tokuda currently serves as the co-director of CyberHawaii, which supports the development of the cyber security workforce.
- She is also the external affairs director for the Nisei Veterans Memorial Center.
- Tokuda previously served in the Hawaii Senate for 12 years.
- *Her priorities include expanding access to mental health services, providing free community college, increasing affordable housing, combating climate change, strengthening gun control laws, and protecting reproductive rights.*



# Jonathan Jackson (D-IL-01)

- Jonathan Jackson defeated Republican Eric Carlson to replace retiring Rep. Bobby Rush.
- Jackson has served as the national spokesman for the Rainbow PUSH Coalition, taught business at the collegiate level, and launched several businesses in the Telecom, breweries, and construction industries.
- He is the son of civil rights leader Jesse Jackson Sr.
- *The key messages of his campaign are:*
  - *“I will fight for good-quality jobs through economic development, higher wages and equal pay for women, affordable housing, and childcare.”*
  - *“I will encourage smarter transportation policies that invest in public transportation.”*
  - *“I will strongly support Medicare for All.”*
  - *“I will support the Green New Deal to improve the environment by investing in climate-protecting industries.”*
  - *“I will push for overdue structural changes to our political and financial systems to provide more tax fairness.”*



# Delia Ramirez (D-IL-03)

- Delia Ramirez defeated Republican Justin Burau for the newly redrawn in IL-03.
- Ramirez is a member of the Illinois General Assembly and currently serves as assistant majority leader.
- She previously worked as a non-profit leader at the Center for Changing Lives, Common Cause and the Community Renewal Society.
- Ramirez served as the board chair for the Latin United Community Housing Association and Logan Square Neighborhood Association.
- *“Since elected, she has successfully passed legislation expanding Medicaid coverage to senior citizens regardless of immigration status, securing over \$450 million to build affordable housing, protecting abortion rights, and creating an elected school board in the city of Chicago.”*



# Nikki Budzinski (D-IL-13)

---

- Nikki Budzinski defeated Republican Regan Deering for the newly drawn seat in IL-13.
- Budzinski served as chief of staff for President Biden's Office of Management and Budget.
- She previously served as Illinois Gov. J.B. Pritzker's senior advisor on labor issues and as the chair of the Illinois Broadband Advisory Council.
- Budzinski worked for the International Association of Fire Fighters and the United Food & Commercial Workers Union.
- *Her priorities include union apprenticeship programs, capping the cost of insulin, extending the Child Tax Credit, reproductive rights, raising the federal minimum wage, passing the PRO Act, and workers' rights.*



# Rudy Yakym (R-IN-02)

- Rudy Yakym defeated Democrat Paul Steury in the race to replace Rep. Jackie Walorski, who passed away in August.
- Yakym works as director of growth initiatives at Kem Krest, a transportation, logistics, and supply chain company .
- He serves as board chair of the Boys & Girls Club of St. Joe County, and he was twice appointed to serve on the Indiana Judicial Nomination Commission and Judicial Qualifications Commission.
- *His priorities include:*
  - *Fighting Inflation and Creating More Jobs*
  - *Supporting our Veterans*
  - *Saving America from the Pelosi-Biden Failed Agenda*
  - *Supporting Law Enforcement and the Rule of Law*
  - *Balancing the Budget and Ending Wasteful Spending*
  - *Creating American Energy Independence and Lowering Energy Prices*
  - *Promoting Economic Opportunities for Working Families*



# Erin Houchin (R-IN-09)

- Erin Houchin defeated Democrat Matthew Fyfe to replace Rep. Trey Hollingsworth, who did not seek reelection.
- Houchin served in the Indiana Senate from November 2014-February 2022.
- Houchin previously worked for the Indiana Department of Child Services and the Community Alliance Promoting Education.
- She also served as the southeast Indiana regional director for former Sen. Dan Coats.
- *“She has a proven record of passing legislation to protect the unborn, defend our second amendment rights, and support law enforcement. She has only supported honestly balanced budgets, aggressively fought tax increases, and expanded broadband access in rural areas.”*



# Morgan McGarvey (D-KY-03)

- Morgan McGarvey defeated Republican Stuart Ray to replace retiring Rep. John Yarmuth.
- McGarvey is currently the minority leader of the Kentucky Senate and has been a member of the body since 2013.
- He previously worked as special assistant to the Attorney General of Kentucky and as a legislative assistant for former Rep. Ben Chandler (D-KY).
- McGarvey earned an undergraduate degree in journalism from the University of Missouri and a law degree from the University of Kentucky.
- *“Morgan is running for Congress to oppose the extreme right-wing agenda of Mitch McConnell and National Republicans. In Congress, Morgan will tackle climate change, criminal justice reform, and build an economy that works for everyone, not just the wealthy.”*



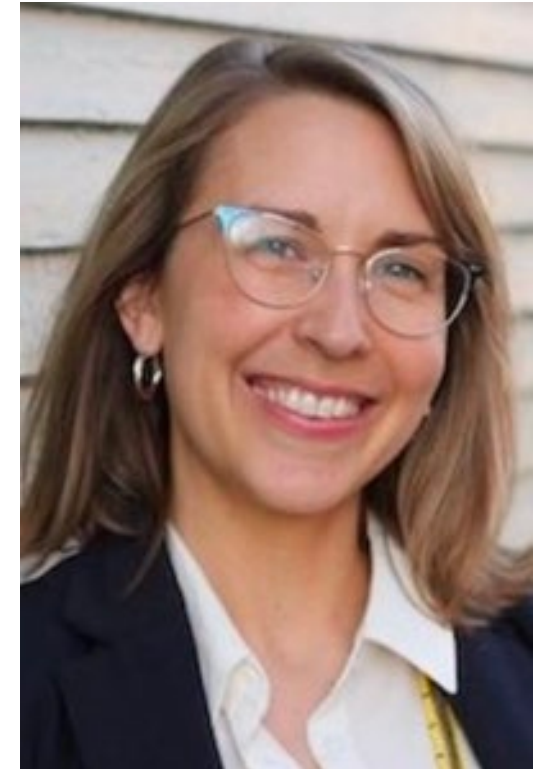
# Glenn Ivey (D-MD-04)

- Glenn Ivey defeated Republican Jeff Warner to replace Rep. Anthony Brown, who ran for Attorney General of Maryland.
- Ivey is currently a Partner with Ivey & Levetown, LLP, and has spent the last 12 years in private practice.
- He previously served as the state's attorney for Prince George's County, chairman of the Maryland Public Service Commission, and as an assistant US attorney in the Clinton Administration.
- Ivey earned an undergraduate degree from Princeton University and a JD from Harvard Law School.
- *His priorities include gun safety, reproductive rights, affordable housing, criminal justice reform, Medicare for All, voting rights, free community college, and the Green New Deal.*



# Hillary Scholten (D-MI-03)

- Hillary Scholten defeated Republican John Gibbs to replace Rep. Peter Meijer, who lost to Gibbs in the Republican primary.
- Scholten is an attorney, who clerked for the US Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit and worked for the Department of Justice during the Obama Administration.
- She also worked for the Michigan Immigrant Rights Center, and is a volunteer attorney with the Times Up Legal Defense Fund.
- *Her priorities include paid family and medical leave, capping prescription drug and insulin costs, reproductive rights, strengthening public schools, protecting Social Security and Medicare, renewable energy, gun safety, and collective bargaining rights.*



# Shri Thanedar (D-MI-13)

---

- Shri Thanedar defeated Republican Martell Bivings to succeed Democratic Rep. Rashida Tlaib, who chose to run in MI-12 following redistricting.
- Thanedar is currently serving his first term as a member of the Michigan House of Representatives.
- In 2018, Thanedar ran for governor on a platform of progressive solutions, including a \$15 minimum wage. He finished third in the Democratic primary.
- Thanedar grew up in India and immigrated to the US when he was 24.
- *Thanedar's priorities include Medicare for All, the Green New Deal, gun safety, voting rights, criminal justice reform, and universal early childhood education.*



# Mike Ezell (R-MS-04)

---

- Mike Ezell defeated Democrat Johnny DuPree to replace Rep. Steven Palazzo, who Ezell defeated in the Republican primary runoff election.
- Ezell is currently the sheriff of the Jackson County, Mississippi and has 40 years of experience in law enforcement.
- He graduated from the Mississippi Law Enforcement Training Academy and the FBI National Academy, and later worked with the FBI on their Safe Streets Task Force.
- *His key issues are supporting law enforcement, protecting the Second Amendment, finishing the wall, stopping taxpayer-funded abortions, fighting socialist spending plans and tax hikes, and pushing for Trump-era policies.*



# Mark Alford (R-MO-04)

---

- Mark Alford defeated Democrat Jack Truman to replace Rep. Vicky Hartzler, who ran for Senate.
- Alford most recently served as the morning news anchor for Fox 4 in Kansas City, a position he held for over 20 years.
- Alford and his wife own and operate the Lonestar Ranch horse stables in South Kansas City.
- He attended the University of Texas at Austin where he studied government and Latin American affairs.
- *His priorities include securing our elections, ending “Bidenflation,” finishing the border wall, protecting the unborn, funding the police, ending critical race theory, and protecting Second Amendment rights from federal overreach.*



# Eric Burlison (R-MO-07)

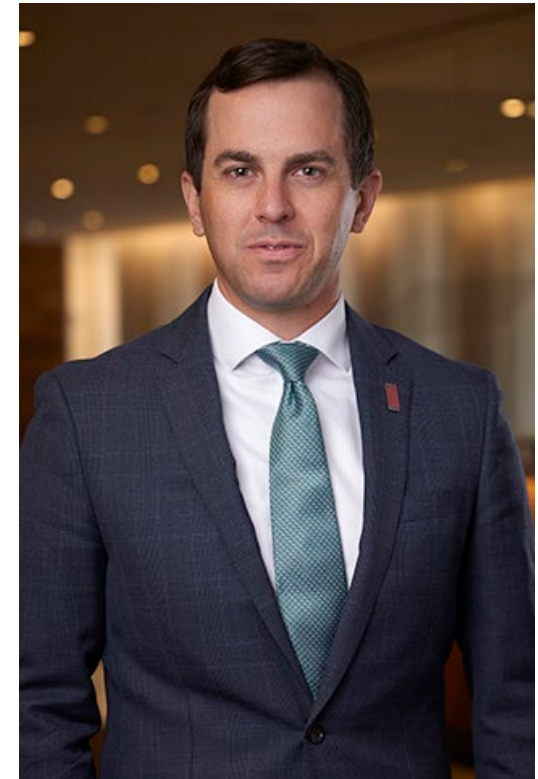

- Eric Burlison defeated Democrat Kristen Radaker-Sheafer to replace Rep. Billy Long, who ran for Senate.
- Burlison is currently a member of the Missouri State Senate. He previously served in the Missouri House of Representatives.
- Burlison also works as a software consultant for Cerner, and as an independent tax consultant and investment adviser.
- *In the legislature, he:*
  - *Sponsored and passed Constitutional Carry and Stand Your Ground laws;*
  - *Sponsored the Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act;*
  - *Was the first legislator in the nation to introduce the Health Care Compact;*

# Rob Menendez (D-NJ-08)

- Rob Menendez defeated Republican Marcus Arroyo to replace retiring Rep. Albio Sires.
- Menendez is currently counsel at the law firm Lowenstein Sandler and is a commissioner of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey.
- He is the son of Sen. Bob Menendez, who previously held this seat as a member of the House.
- *Three key messages of his campaign are:*
  - *“AFFORDABILITY: Providing federal support to increase housing supply, including more affordable housing with a nexus to public transportation, and working towards federal solutions for the ongoing supply chain crisis are key priorities and will be a main focus in Congress day one.”*
  - *“CHILD CARE AND EDUCATION: I will support legislation that expands and extends the Child Tax Credit, caps child care costs at 7% of income for many families, and implements universal preschool for all families.”*
  - *“PROTECTING ORGANIZED LABOR: I will be a strong advocate for our brothers and sisters in organized labor and their right to organize for fair wages, safer working conditions, and respect for workers... I strongly believe Congress must pass critical legislation like the PRO Act and the Public Service Freedom to Negotiate Act to protect the right to organize.”*



# Dan Goldman (D-NY-10)

- Dan Goldman defeated Republican Benine Hamdan for the newly redrawn seat in NY-10.
- Goldman served as lead counsel during former President Donald Trump's first impeachment.
- Goldman spent 10 years as an assistant United States attorney for the Southern District of New York.
- He received his undergraduate degree from Yale University and his law degree from Stanford University.
- *His priorities include protecting our democracy and voting rights, codifying abortion rights, enacting common-sense gun control, expanding the middle class, investing in public education, reining in defense spending, and addressing climate change.*



# Nick Langworthy (R-NY-23)

- Nick Langworthy defeated Democrat Max Della Pia to replace Rep. Joe Sempolinski, who did not seek reelection.

- He previously served as an assistant district attorney in Gaston County, NC, and is also of counsel at the law firm Womble Bond Dickinson.
- *“Jeff has helped lead the fight against gerrymandering, stood against discriminatory legislation like HB2, supported investments in early childhood education, repeatedly called for raising teacher pay and expanding Medicaid, passed reforms for our criminal justice system, and called out corruption.”*



# Greg Landsman (D-OH-01)

- Greg Landsman defeated incumbent Rep. Steve Chabot.

- Seth Magaziner defeated Republican Allan Fung to replace retiring Rep. Jim Langevin.
- Magaziner has served as general treasurer of Rhode Island since 2015.
- Magaziner previously worked as a VP at Trillium Asset Management and worked for Teach for America in Louisiana.
- He graduated from Brown and earned his MBA at Yale.
- *His priorities include ending gun violence, lowering energy costs, investing in clean energy, reproductive rights, protecting Social Security and Medicare, job training and apprenticeship programs, extending the Child Tax Credit, and universal preschool.*



# Andy Ogles (R-TN-05)

- Andy Ogles defeated Democrat Heidi Campbell to replace Rep. Jim Cooper, who chose not to seek reelection after redistricting.
- Ogles is currently the mayor of Maury County.
- He previously served as the executive director and chief lobbyist for the Tennessee chapter of Americans for Prosperity.
- Ogles also served as the national deputy director for Newt Gingrich's 2012 presidential campaign.
- *His priorities include defending the Second Amendment, securing the border, protecting the unborn, defunding Planned Parenthood, and promoting an individualized approach to education.*



# Russell Fry (R-SC-07)

  - *Sponsored and passed the Fetal Heartbeat Bill;*
  - *Stewarded the passage of the Religion is Essential Act; and*
  - *Cosponsored bills to expand school choice, ban vaccine passports, save women's sports, and require ID to vote via absentee ballot.*



# Nathaniel Moran (R-TX-01)

---

- Nathaniel Moran defeated Democrat Jrmarr Jefferson to replace Rep. Louie Gohmert, who ran for attorney general of Texas.
- Moran has served as the county judge in Smith County since 2016.
- He previously served on the Tyler City Council.
- He attended the US Military Academy and Texas Tech University, where he received a bachelor's degree in Russian, an MBA, and a law degree.
- *His priorities include advancing pro-life legislation, increasing security on the southern border, protecting the Second Amendment, and promoting fiscal responsibility.*



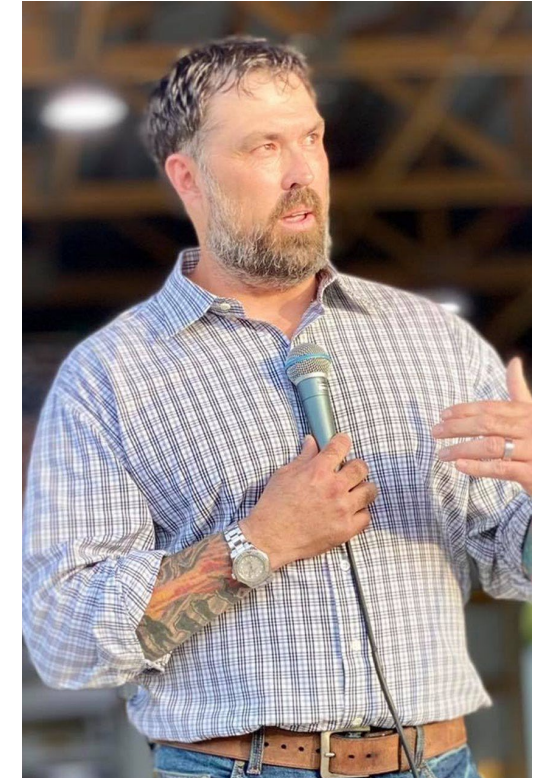
# Keith Self (R-TX-03)

- Luttrell served in the Navy for 14 years before retiring in 2014 to help other veterans struggling with traumatic brain injuries.
- He earned an advanced degree in applied cognition and neuroscience at the University of Texas at Dallas and created an innovative health and wellness platform to help veterans.
- *His priorities include improving border security, cybersecurity, and promoting pro-life policies.*



# Jasmine Crockett (D-TX-30)

- Jasmine Crockett defeated Republican James Rodgers to replace retiring Rep. Eddie Bernice Johnson.
- Crockett currently serves as a member of the Texas House and is a founding member and vice chair of the Texas Progressive Caucus.
- She previously worked as a civil rights attorney at her own firm, and as a public defender for Bowie County, Texas
- During the George Floyd protests, she successfully represented 600 protestors pro-bono.
- *Three key messages of her campaign are:*
  - *“I am a believer and defender of democracy, especially when it comes to voting rights.”*
  - *“We are struggling economically more-so than ever, which is why I will work to bring good paying jobs to the district.”*
  - *“In the midst of this pandemic, we in Texas are especially suffering from health care coverage neglect. I am committed to expanding access to healthcare in Texas.”*



# Greg Casar (D-TX-35)

- Greg Casar defeated Republican Dan McQueen to succeed Democratic Rep. Lloyd Doggett, who chose to run in TX-37 following redistricting.
- Casar was a member of the Austin City Council from January 2015-February 2022.
- He was born in Houston to Mexican immigrants and earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Virginia.
- *As a member of the Austin City Council, he has:*
  - *authored paid-sick-days laws;*
  - *raised wages for the city's lowest-paid employees from \$7.25/hour to \$15/hour with health care benefits;*
  - *led the largest affordable housing elections in Texas history, and personally organized with tenants to block evictions and help mobile home communities purchase their own property;*
  - *ended all arrests and fines for low-level marijuana possession in Austin;*
  - *closed tax loopholes for the wealthy.*



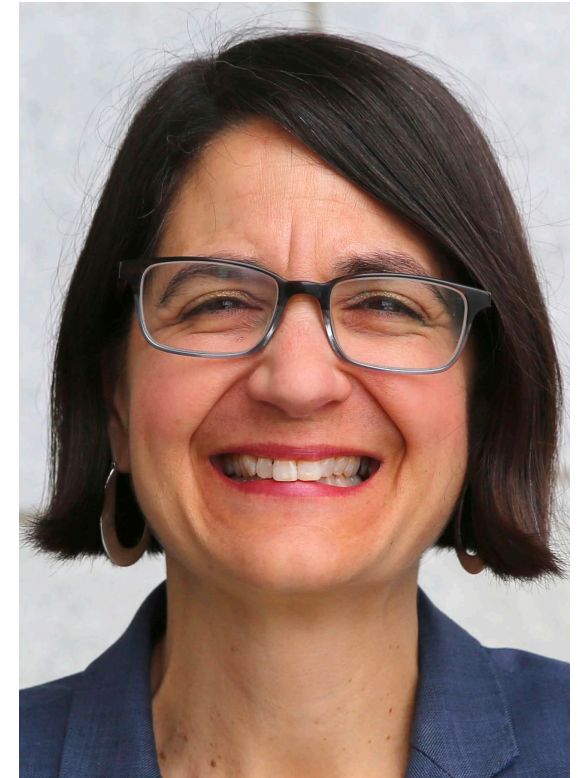
# Wesley Hunt (R-TX-38)

- *Her priorities include reducing spending and regulations to lower inflation, border security, funding the military and law enforcement, reforming the VA, school choice, ending Critical Race Theory, election reform, and protecting the sanctity of life.*



# Harriet Hageman (R-WY-At-Large)

- Harriet Hageman defeated Democrat Lynette Grey Bull to replace Rep. Liz Cheney, who she defeated in the Republican primary election.

- She was a candidate in the 2018 Wyoming gubernatorial election, where she finished third in the Republican primary.

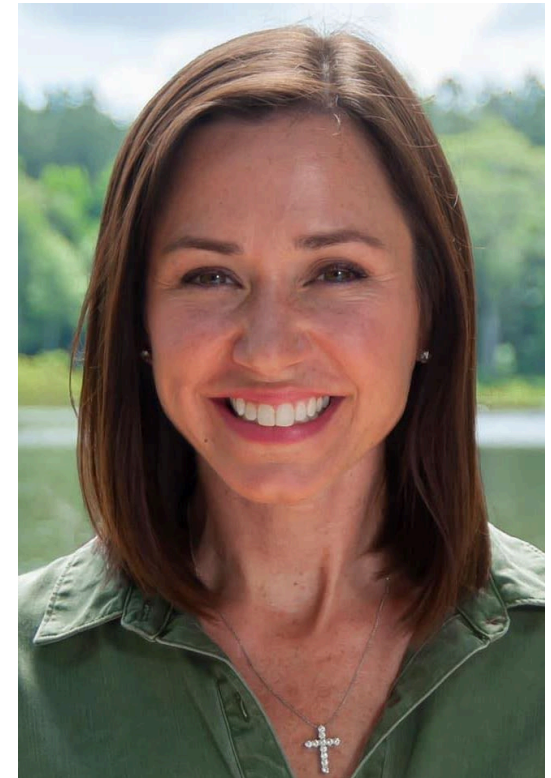

# Markwayne Mullin (R-OK)

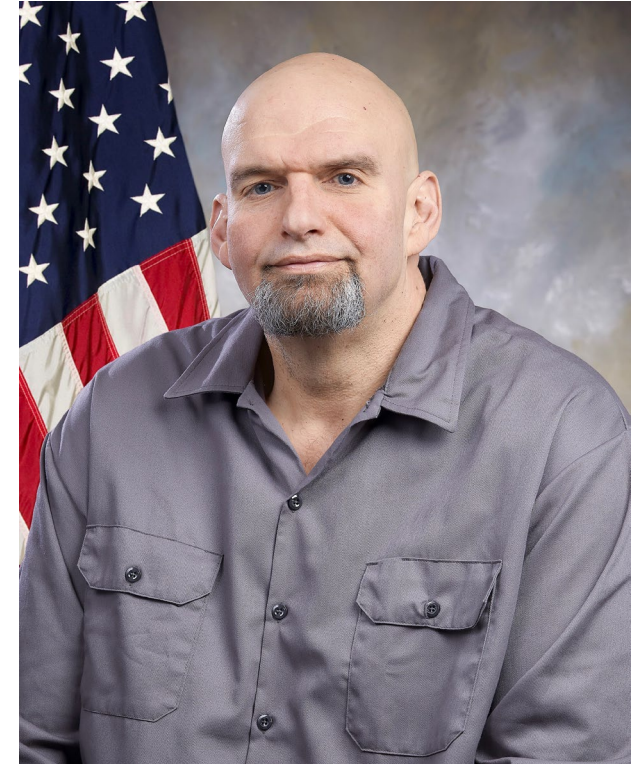
- Markwayne Mullin defeated Democrat Kendra Horn to serve the remainder of retiring Sen. Jim Inhofe's term.

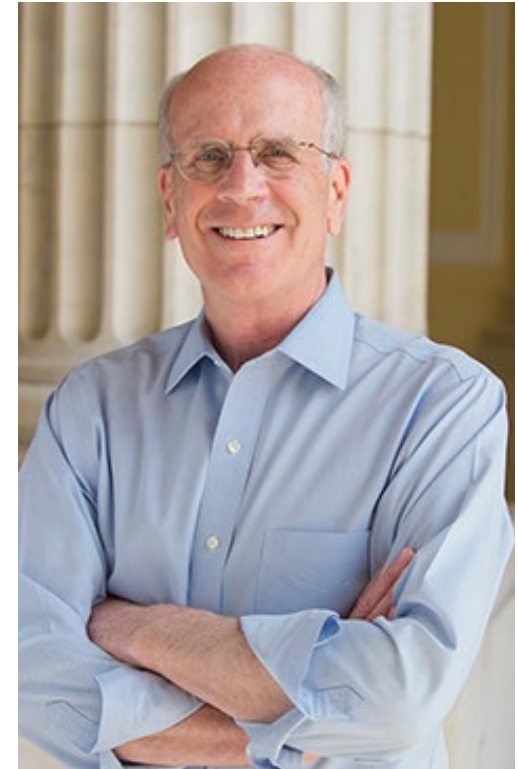

# Maura Healey (D-MA)

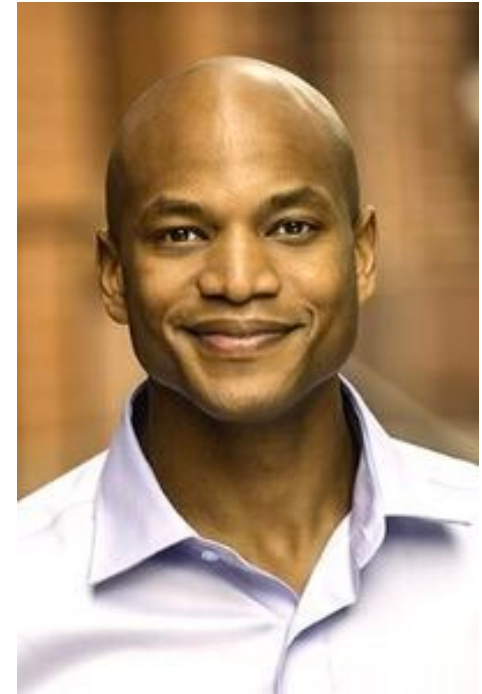
- Maura Healey defeated Republican Geoff Diehl to replace Gov. Charlie Baker, who did not seek reelection.
