Reached new highs in 2025, with 57% of Americans adults gambling in any form and 134 million visiting a casino property

Is driven by consumer recognition of gaming as a technologically innovative product offering strong entertainment value compared to alternatives.

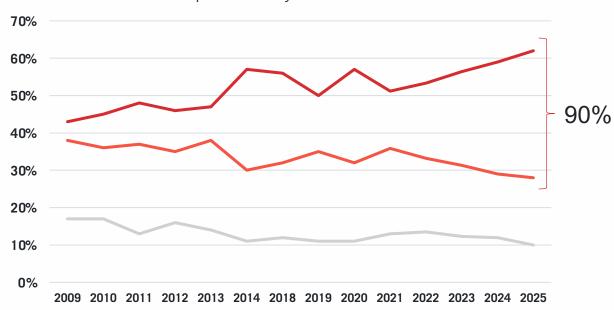

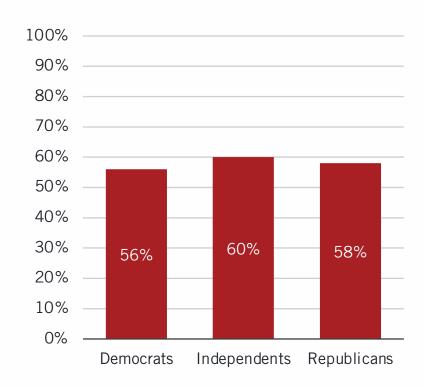
# ::: Gambling Participation Reaches 57%

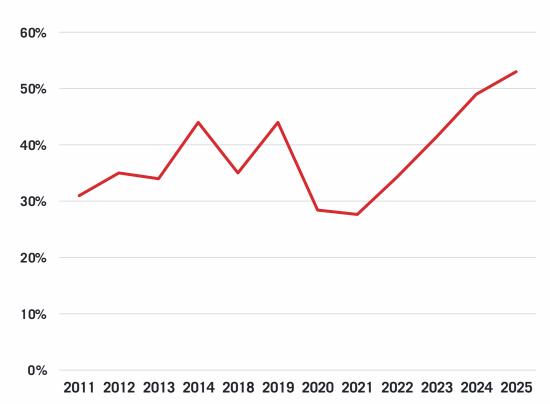

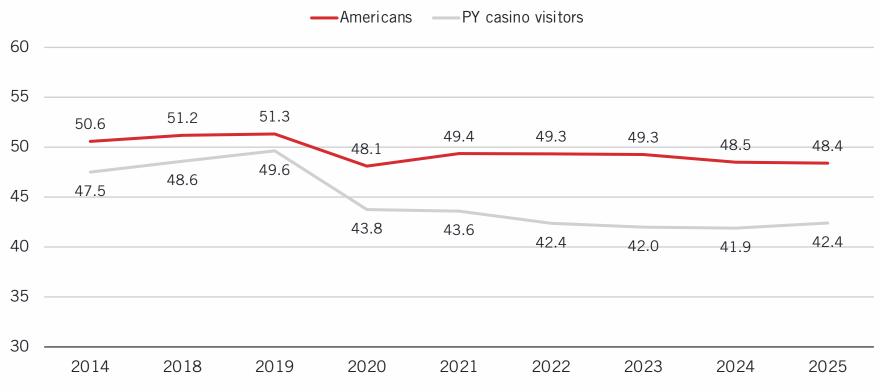

#### **PY Casino Visitor Mean Age**

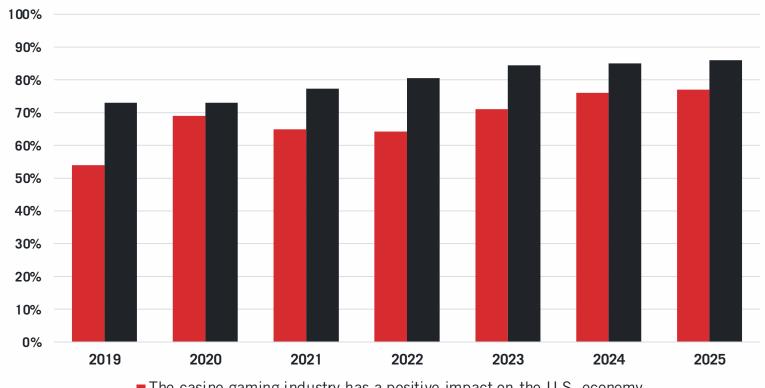

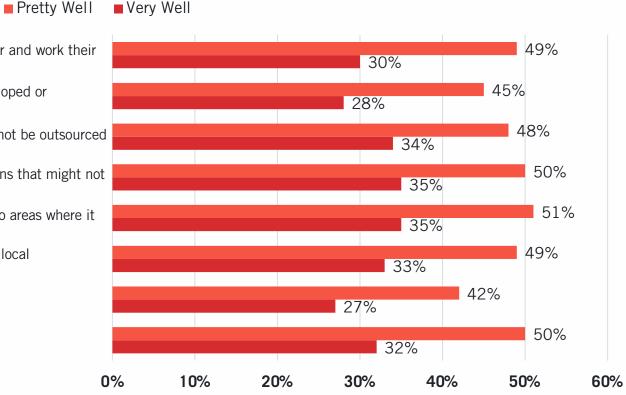

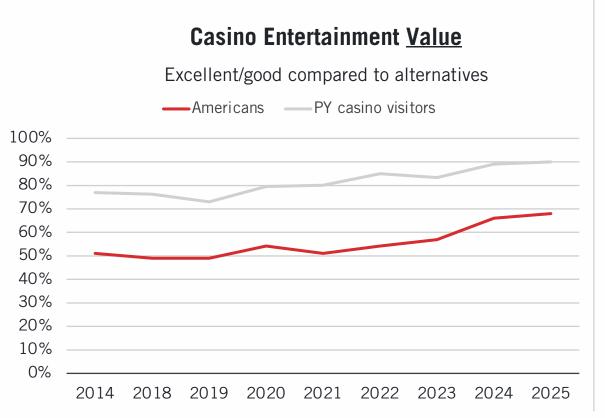


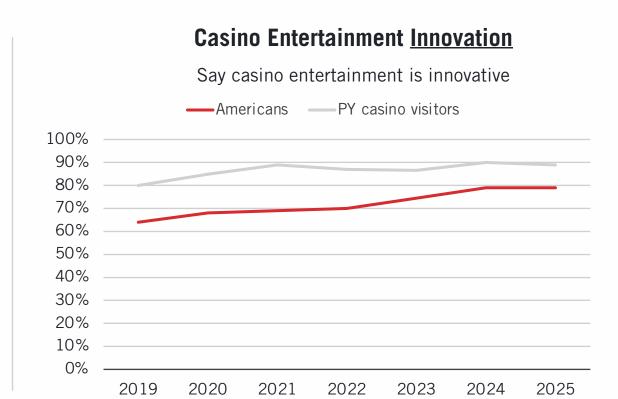

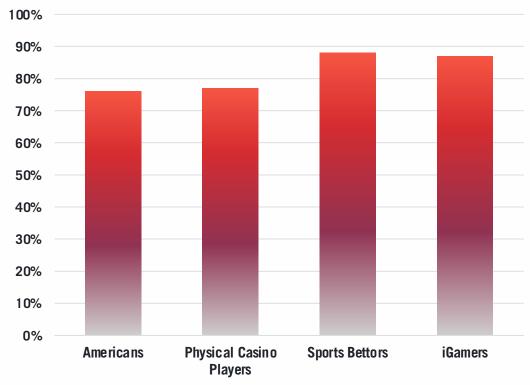

% SAYING INDUSTRY RG PROGRAMS ARE VERY/SOMEWHAT EFFECTIVE



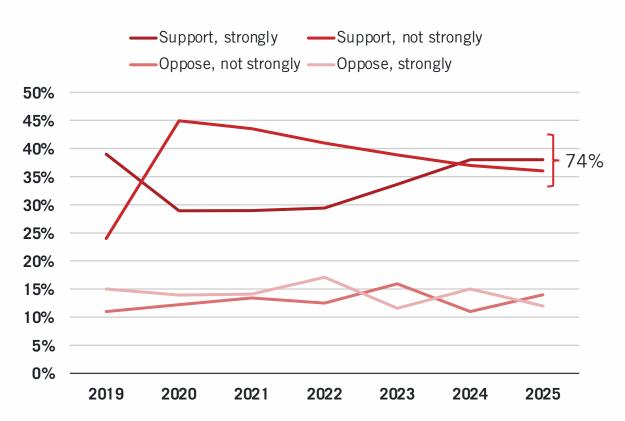

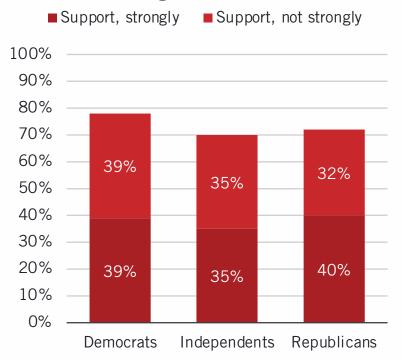


# ::: Persistent, Widespread, Bipartisan Support for Legal Sports Betting

# ::: Survey Methodology

#### **MARGIN OF ERROR**

- ◆ Americans (n=2,001): Nationally representative sample of registered voters aged 21+\*
- ▶ Past-year casino visitors (n=1,055): Visited a casino in the last 12 months to gamble or for some other reason
- ◆ Past-year gamblers (n=1,146): Participated in any form of gambling at all during the past 12 months, whether at a casino or racetrack, at a sportsbook, a lottery location, at a bar, tavern or truck stop, or over the Internet
  - ◆ Physical casino players (n=602): Participated in physical casino gaming in the last 12 months.
  - ◆ Sports bettors (n=430): Participated in sports betting online, at a physical sportsbook, or with a bookie in the last 12 months.
  - iGamers (n=461): Participated in real-money casino gaming over the internet in the last 12 months.
